FREE MEALS for the 2026-2027 school year!!

Breakfast and lunch will be at no cost
again this year for all students in the
School District of Pickens County!

How is this possible?

Through the Community Eligibility
Provision (CEP). CEP allows meals at no
cost for all students based on overall
economic status. It eliminates the need
for free or reduced meal applications.

What does this mean?

- No applications or additional information is required.
- You can skip the lunchbox! Let us help you save time and money this school year. Remember one breakfast and one lunch per school day are free.
- If a student wishes to get a 2nd breakfast or a 2nd lunch, they must have money on their account.
- Studies show that children that eat breakfast and lunch have fewer tardies, higher test scores and fewer behavioral issues.
- If a student has a negative balance on their lunch account from previous years, please make sure this is paid.

What is a meal?

- Lunch (5 items) — meat/meat alternate, vegetable, fruit, grain/bread, milk
- Breakfast (4 items) — meat/meat alternate, fruit, grain/bread, milk
- USDA policy requires a student to have 3 of the 5 meal items at lunch and 3 of the 4 meal items at breakfast. For lunch and breakfast, one of the 3 items must be a fruit or vegetable. Otherwise, the student will be charged the individual price of each.
